

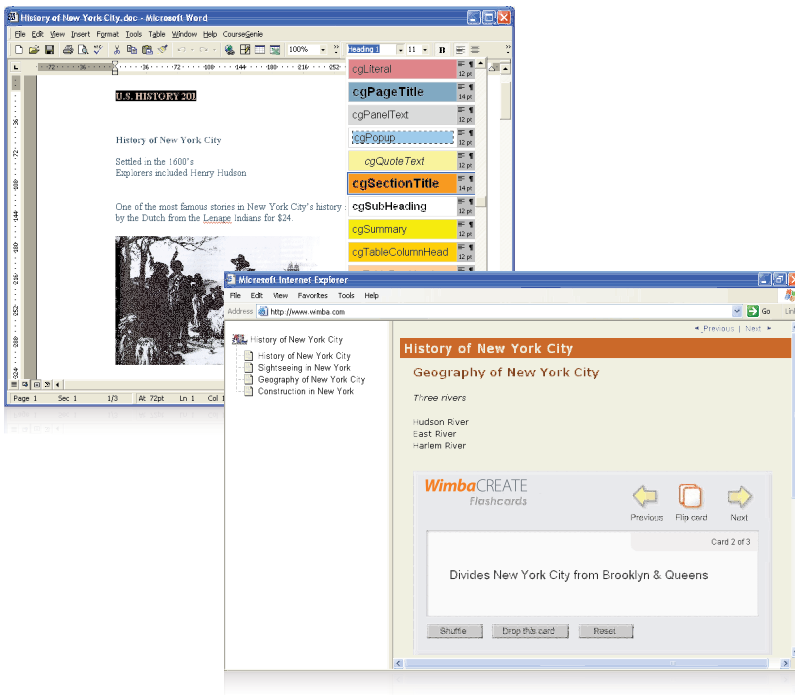

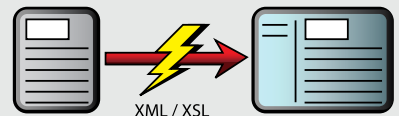

Why is Wimba Create better than "Save as Web Page" in Word™?

The "Save as Web Page" option in Microsoft Word™ produces very dense Microsoft-specific HTML code that often needs to be cleaned up and simplified using Dreamweaver or other special utilities. Wimba bypasses this completely and generates simple, clean XML and HTML code that is validated against W3C standards. It is this clean XML that is transformed into the chosen output format.

Why not import a Word™ document directly into your CMS/VLE?

When an instructor uploads a Microsoft Word™ document into a CMS/VLE, the document exists only as a single file for download by a user. Wimba Create takes an ordinary Word™ file and brings it to life by dividing the content into web friendly components through which the student can freely navigate, helping keep student attention. And by using Wimba Create instructors can add interactive study elements such as flashcards and practice questions that will encourage mastery of the material.
